Q&A with Alyson Stover, AOTA President

e asked Alyson Stover, MOT, JD, OTR/L, BCP, what inspired her to choose "Different but Same" as the topic for her AOTA INSPIRE 2024 Presidential Address, and why she is looking forward to AOTA INSPIRE 2024 in Orlando.

Different but same was actually the first "phrase" I ever learned in American Sign Language (ASL). My ASL professor and I were having an after-class discussion about the trials of raising children. Throughout the conversation we were laughing at so many shared "mom fails." At one point, she paused and said, "My husband and I are deaf, you are not, and although our houses may look different, the goings on inside are really the same." We are different but same.

As I have had the honor of traveling across the country, observing, exploring, and immersing myself in occupational therapy in hospitals, private practices, community programs, schools, pelvic floor practices, academic occupational therapy programs, academic occupational therapy

assistant programs, research labs, and all the places occupational therapy happens, I found myself having the same conversation. Laughing with many members of the occupational therapy community about that time our client was working so hard they accidently

screamed out a curse word, and we paused as the entire space got quiet, looked around, and laughed hysterically, strengthening the bond we felt with that person in the moment. Becoming tearful together, as we recalled the fight to advocate with our client so they could remain in their home, and feeling the compassion fatigue of a battle lost. And becoming frustrated together discussing declining reimbursement experiences and encountering barriers to practicing our incredible profession in its full scope. Different but same was a theme that resonated with me after every trip.

We are all members of the occupational therapy community, but we are professionals from diverse backgrounds, working in diverse settings, implementing diverse interventions with diverse client communities, in diverse geographical locations, and yet we can laugh at shared sameness. Different but same.
